

LEISTON'S FIRST BOOK FESTIVAL

It was seeing the popularity of other Suffolk literary festivals that prompted local author Robert Ashton to organise Leiston's first book festival, which takes place on Saturday 7th September at the town's Edwardian Film Theatre. The day will see six nonfiction authors on stage, each a book that explores our evolving landscape and environment.

"We wanted to be different from other local book festivals", Robert Ashton explained, "so have a day of writers who have written about our changing world from different perspectives." Venue costs have been sponsored by Leiston Town Council, and a grant from Sizewell Creative makes this a very affordable day, with tickets for the full programme £30 (£25 for over 65s and £10 for those under 18).

The organisers hope that the conversations on stage will inform, inspire and perhaps prompt people to see the natural world around them a little differently.

The audience will hear about 20th century Suffolk writers George Ewart Evans and Adrian Bell; gain an insight into declining bird numbers; learn about Doggerland, that once connected Suffolk to Belgium and be taken to the remote landscapes of

Scandinavia and the High Caucuses, contrasting them to our familiar Suffolk coastline. "Most people will have heard of one or two of our authors," commented co-organiser Abbie Clements of Halesworth Bookshop, "but we also want people to discover new writers and enjoy reading their books."

VJ DAY SERVICE OF COMMEMORATION

Long Shop Museum, Leiston

17th August 2024 10.45

On Saturday 17 August, the Leiston Branch of the 'Friends of the Suffolk Regiment' and 'Royal British Legion' will be holding their annual service of commemoration at the Long Shop Museum to remember those from the town who served in the Far East between 1942 and 1945.


For those who may be unaware, the Long Shop Museum is home to a unique war memorial. There, framed upon its walls, is a Union Flag that has special significance to many men of the town who fought in the Far East with the Suffolk Regiment, and who were later taken prisoner at the fall of Singapore.

Corporal Herbie Bailey along with another Far East Prisoner of War (FEPoW), Sergeant Wilf Goddard, were both Leiston men and had been pre-war members of the Territorial Army. They were determined that the Flag should be framed as a permanent memorial to all their comrades who died in captivity and sadly never came home. The importance of this simple memorial cannot be underestimated. It is the only war memorial in the United Kingdom which takes the form of an object from the time in which it commemorates. All other war memorials and tablets were erected later, after the events they seek to commemorate. The Friends of the Suffolk Regiment who are the custodians of this important piece of local and regimental history, are committed to ensuring the memorial's long-term preservation and its continued home in the Long Shop Museum.

We warmly invite you all to attend and share with us a moment of reflection for all those men of the town who paid the ultimate sacrifice and who never returned. This short service of commemoration will start at 10.45am with the Wreath Laying Ceremony.

SAXMUNDHAM RUNNING AND FITNESS CLUB

The Saxons 5 Mile Race

The Saxons operate as one of the sporting sections of the Saxmundham Sports & Recreational Club, a registered charity that owns the Carlton Park sports ground at Saxmundham, Suffolk. The club has more than 50 members and is run entirely by volunteers.

The aim of the club is to teach the principles of running and training with the emphasis on having fun while getting fit. Club nights are Tuesdays and Thursdays and ages range from young adults to people in their seventies.

Chris Fuller, from Leiston, joined The Saxons in September 2021. He had only started running a month earlier, encouraged by one of his sisters who thought it would be a good idea for him to get out of the house and do a Parkrun 5k at Sizewell.

That first run started Chris's obsession with running that has seen him go from strength to strength, improving not only his fitness but his mental health.

Chris said: "I joined The Saxons club as I wanted to run with other people and to keep healthy. I've made a lot of friends that I go running with now which has made me faster and pushed me with my running and my fitness. When I first came to the club I was nervous to start with but within three or four weeks I was fine."

James Wilson, head coach of The Saxons said: "Chris started at Saxmundham Saxons in 2021, shortly after completing his first Parkrun at Sizewell in 29 minutes 11 seconds. Since then, he has knocked nearly 10 minutes off that time, achieved personal best times throughout all distances every month, has now completed Marathons and is preparing for an Ultra Marathon in September.

"Chris is the embodiment of what running is about: determination, resilience and most of all enjoyment. To be able to have the opportunity to watch Chris not just grow as an athlete, but vastly increase his self-esteem and confidence has been greatly rewarding for me as a coach."

The annual Saxons Five Mile Race takes place on Sunday, October 6 at Carlton Park, IP17 1AT. On offer is a multi-terrain course on footpaths, fields, and roads. The family-friendly event comprises a junior fun run followed by an adult race in which 250 participants can take part.

On the day of the race, Chris will be taking a day off from his routine of running races every weekend across East Anglia, and with fellow club members will be volunteering as a marshal. The junior fun run starts at 10am and costs £2 to enter, and the adult race for ages 15 and over starts at 11am. Registration costs £16 or £14 for affiliated club runners. Chris added: "It'll be good seeing all the runners coming to our club from all the different clubs and doing our race. There are all kinds of people at the races of all speeds and abilities. Some people are really fast and

very athletic, some people are in their seventies and it's inspiring how they do it. This time four years ago I would never have thought I could do a half marathon let alone a marathon, it's crazy. I'd say have a go, give it a go - you never know what you can do in life."

As part of the Film Theatre safety regime, the various grey wall coverings, wall drapes and stage curtains have to be treated every three years with a specialist flame retardant treatment system. The Friends were responsible for funding both the stage curtains and wall drapes and were pleased to offset these costs of £3,022.84 to support the venue.

FREE HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES AND FOOD THIS SUMMER

Filmmaking, theatre, cooking, sport, mindfulness, STEM and outdoor adventure are just some of the free activities on offer during the school holidays across East Suffolk this summer.

Numerous organisations across the district are providing fun and enriching activities and food as part of a programme of experiences for children and young people over the coming weeks. There are 46 programmes on offer with over 7,700 places available.

The Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) programme has been funded by the UK Government for three years providing over £200m per year for enriching activities for children and young people, particularly those in receipt of free school meals. The HAF programme is overseen by Suffolk County Council and coordinated locally by East Suffolk Council.

Holiday activities are varied and can introduce young people to new experiences and skills, from dance and drama to cooking and filmmaking, as well providing opportunities for physical and social activity.

In Suffolk, the programme is targeted at those eligible for benefitsrelated free school meals, and other vulnerable children, or those with additional needs who would benefit from accessing the programme.

Cllr Sarah Whitelock, East Suffolk Council's cabinet member for Communities, Culture, Leisure and Tourism said: "Holiday activity programmes enable young people to get involved in a wide range of different activities to help keep them active over the summer holidays,

benefitting both their physical and mental health. The activities are a way for children to meet new people and learn new skills. They also provide support for families who may be struggling with the costs of food and energy during the school holidays."

Each funded holiday activity also offers a free meal, and places are redeemed by eligible families through the booking system Eequ. Families can select the programmes and dates they wish to attend, and which young people will be attending. The booking system will ask about HAF eligibility, and the booking will be reviewed and approved by the HAF team at Suffolk County Council.

ALDE VALLEY SUFFOLK FAMILY HISTORY GROUP

'The Pirate Radio Revolution' of the 60s.

If you didn't manage to see this talk by Charles Wright and Brian Nichols, then you missed a treat! Forty members and visitors were joined by several more online to hear Charles and Brian tell the June meeting of the Alde Valley Suffolk Family History Group about the Pirate Radio Revolution of the 60s. Several of the AVSFHG's committee dressed up for the occasion and one had brought along a transistor radio made locally by Pye in Yoxford.

Charles explained that he and a friend, Tom Day, built a radio station in his bedroom in Trimley when he was just 15 years old. He called it Radio Walthamstow to confuse the authorities with their illicit broadcasting which, in reality only went a few hundred yards.

I won't readily forget the image of Charles in a cupboard lined with empty egg boxes to act as sound proofing! Charles and Brian demonstrated effectively and comically why a revolution was needed on the radio, because the BBC played "nice music and nice serials" but they just weren't playing popular music.

Although a late-comer to the 1960s I had heard of some of the offshore Radio Stations such as Radio Luxemburg and Radio Caroline but not of the other stations that were mentioned, such as Radio Veronica (Dutch) and Radio Mercur (Scandinavian).

This year celebrates 60th anniversary of Radio Caroline and it was interesting to note that the station was initially moored off the Felixstowe coast. Charles' late brother (Andy Wright) shot cine footage of a visit to see Radio Caroline where the

famous radio DJs (disc jockeys) came out on deck and introduced themselves because no-one actually knew what they looked like!

Caroline was on air from 6am to 6pm daily and the first record played by DJ Christopher Moore was 'Not Fade Away' by the Rolling Stones: "I'm gonna tell you how it's gonna be, you're gonna give your love to me." Many other DJs were mentioned, including Tony Blackburn, but the one that I associate the most with the 60s was that of Simon Dee. He joined Radio Caroline in March 1964, though I remember him later as the TV host of Juke Box Jury. Though offshore radio

became illegal, Radio Caroline carried on broadcasting until 1991 when it was forced to dock after running aground. Radio Caroline now broadcasts legally.

Charles and Brian recounted the history of Caroline in detail but also included information about other offshore radio such Radio London, Radio Scarborough and Radio Northsea International. With a mix of rare cine footage, photographs, music and jingles we were all able to easily reminisce about radio in the 1960s and 70s. GROUPS INVITED TO BID AS £23M FUNDING POT OPENS

Suffolk Community Foundation is inviting eligible charitable and not-for-profit groups in East Suffolk to bid for a share of up to £23m following the opening of the Sizewell C Community Fund.

Around £2m will be made available each year for the next 10 years. The money will be awarded to projects in the East Suffolk Council area that promote the economic, social or environmental wellbeing of the communities most impacted by the construction of Sizewell C, and which enhance people's quality of life.

Melanie Craig, Chief Executive of Suffolk Community Foundation, said: "We are delighted to open the Sizewell C Community Fund, which will make a significant difference to our local communities over the coming decade. We will focus on using our expertise to make sure this money benefits those communities most where work is taking place for the Sizewell C project.

"This is an exciting opportunity which comes at a time when rising demand and reductions in central funding are placing charities and community groups under ever increasing pressure. The money therefore has the potential to make a real and lasting difference.

"We are looking forward to using the extensive experience we have built up over the past 19 years to ensure it is put to the best possible use for local people."

Grants will be decided by an awards panel made up of representatives from Suffolk

Community Foundation, Suffolk County Council, East Suffolk Council and Sizewell C, as well as four independent members who have a close connection to the area. The panel will meet four times each year to award the money.

Julia Pyke, Sizewell C Joint Managing
Director, said: "The Sizewell C Community
Fund is a wonderful way to ensure that local
communities benefit from the Sizewell C
project for years to come. It's a key part of the

Also, from June 2024, by law, all pet cats in England must be microchipped before they reach the age of 20 weeks (this applies to indoor-only

cats, too). You must also keep your contact details up to date on a DEFRA-approved microchipping database. Cats are naturally inquisitive animals and you will want to do all you can to protect against accidents. This includes providing appropriate health care and safety, both inside and out.

The average life expectancy of a cat is around 14 years, with many living well beyond this age. It is important to be able to assess your cat's quality of life to prevent suffering as they get older or become ill. If there comes a time when your cat is in continual pain, discomfort or distress, the most loving and courageous way you can show how much you care is to end their suffering. Making the decision to

euthanise your muchloved pet is a difficult one and guidance from your vet will be invaluable at this stage.

Even if it doesn't answer all your questions, it can help you understand the issue better, and identify the questions you want to ask us in an email, phone call or face to face.

website, or by emailing us at info@caes,org.uk. Remember to leave us your name and number, so we can call you back.

Migration to Universal Credit

Universal Credit replaces what are known as "Legacy Benefits" - Income Support, Child and Working Tax Credits, Housing Benefit, Income-related Employment and Support Allowance, and Income-based Job Seekers Allowance. Throughout 2024 people in Suffolk receiving any of these benefits will be contacted by the DWP to be migrated to Universal Credit. Once you have applied for Universal Credit you cannot go back to the Legacy Benefits. This is part of a national roll out and is not voluntary. When contacted you will have at least three months from the date of your migration notice to apply for Universal Credit, this deadline date will be included in your migration notice. If you do not apply for Universal Credit within this time your Legacy Benefits will be stopped without being replaced by Universal Credit.

There is transitional support in place for those for whom their Universal Credit is less than the amount they received from their Legacy Benefits. This will be reduced over time until you receive what you would have received through Universal Credit. You must apply within the deadline in your migration notice to be considered for transitional protection.

There are very few exceptions to those being migrated to Universal Credit. From August 2024, those over state pension age and who receive Tax Credits will be asked to apply for either Universal Credit or Pension Credit depending on their circumstances. Which benefit you should apply for will be detailed in your migration letter. Some recipients of Employment and Support Allowance will not be migrated until 2028/29, again this will depend on individual circumstances.

If you receive a migration notice which does not include a deadline you do not need to apply at this time. In these circumstances you should check if you would be worse off before applying. If you do apply you can never go back to your Legacy Benefits.

If you have any concerns about how this change will affect you, or you need help to claim Universal Credit, you should contact Help to Claim which is managed by Citizens Advice. The phone number is 0800-144-844.

LEISTON ALLOTMENT HOLDER & GARDENERS ASSOCIATION

August: The weather in August is often the same as in July - if July was wet, August is likely to be the same! Plan your garden for 'cool season' crops. Begin to collect seeds from your best plants for next year's garden.

Vegetables: Keep ahead with the regular autumn jobs such as hoeing, feeding and watering. If any dry spells, keep harvesting all your crops as they mature (i.e. beetroot, turnips, etc). Plant out any remaining spring cabbages, draw a little soil around the stems to help prevent wind damage. Clear away spent crops as soon as completed.

Fruit: Prune blackcurrants by removing branches that have fruited this year. Reduce side shoots on red and white currants by about two thirds. If strawberries have finished fruiting, remove straw and add a general fertilizer. Plant out your 'plant runners' in a prepared strawberry bed.

Flowers: Pinch out tops of chrysanthemums and take cuttings. Plant daffodils by the end of the month.


Dahlias: Keep spraying against pests, and feed with liquid fertilizer. Keep plants ties to 'supports' as they grow.

Roses: Remove blooms as they fade, stop feeding, but continue spraying if greenfly is still a problem.

Greenhouse: Continue as last month watering, feeding and tying in tomatoes and cucumbers as necessary. Tomatoes should be kept well-watered to help avoid blossom end rot. Remove side shoots from cordon tomatoes. If you have problems with slugs and snails, extra care needed if watering is done in the evening. As slugs and snails adore moist overnight conditions, organic pellets should help keep population down.

"The standard is high, but we continue to compete well, and will be looking to be in the mix throughout. Luckily, we are blessed with some fantastic players and some fantastic sponsors, including Jordan Fencing, Flick & Son and Fishers, as well as many others. Running a club at our level, with first team trips to the midlands on a regular basis means we are very grateful to all those who help our community club."

However, Leiston isn't all about the first team. It is indeed a true community club, with an U23 team, U18 team and a plethora of youth sides, including this season for the first time at least one girls' team.

"We're very excited about the teams below the first team and especially our youth teams, including our girls team this season," Mr Crisp added. "That's an exciting addition to our team line-ups. Our club is a community and we want our young people to aspire to be a big part of that, as well as become better footballers, and enjoy the friendship of being part of a team."

A new 3G pitch is set to be installed at Victory Road in the coming year or so - a wonderful facility that will be available not just for Leiston Football Club use, but for community and local use as well. It's part of much of the exciting work going on at Victory Road.

Founded in 1880, Leiston Football Club is one of the oldest non-league clubs in the UK, but it heads into 2024 in as good a shape as it has ever been, with local support so crucial.
