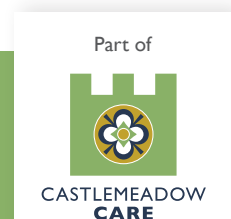

WOODBIDGE TOWN COUNCIL – MAYOR’S MONTHLY

On the 20th May, at the Annual Meeting of the Town Council, I was elected by my fellow Councillors to a second term as Mayor. It is a privilege to serve and I am grateful for all the support I have received during my first year and I hope it will continue in the next 12 months.

When I look back over the past year, I am proud of many things that Woodbridge Town Council has achieved including:

- In May 2025, we signed an agreement with Doullens in France as a first step to renewing our Town’s commitment to international twinning.
- From summer 2025, we picked up the challenge of Local Government Reorganisation with a view to taking ownership of some or all of the green and built spaces in Woodbridge owned by East Suffolk Council and Suffolk County Council. It is early days and there are many challenges ahead.
- In September 2025 the very first outcome of the Active Travel Woodbridge scheme became visible – a new zebra crossing near St Mary’s School. I remain hopeful that delivery will speed up over the next year and that our roads will consequently become safer for all users.
- In February, our new in-house gardening team took the first steps in restoring our parks.
- In April, following the recent celebration of its 450th birthday, the Shire Hall was surrounded by scaffolding as we finally began the first phase of the restoration that the Town has asked us to undertake.

The biggest lesson I have learnt in my first year is that as a town we need to set our level of ambition and stop expecting others to pay for it. We will need to pay for it through our own efforts by working together, pooling skills, finding time, making donations and accepting that there will be an impact on the local tax you pay to your council. We will also need to become smarter at accessing grants and other forms of funding.

Looking ahead there are in my view two areas that need even greater attention:

- As a community we need to take much stronger action to help mitigate the impact of the cost-of-living crisis on our town and its residents.
- As we all get increasingly affected by the green energy revolution taking over East Suffolk, we need a broad alliance of residents and visitors demanding a step change in the infrastructure – a road system that is transformed, more frequent passenger trains and a bus network that actually offers a viable alternative to the car.

I am looking forward to working with my fellow Councillors and residents over the coming year.

This year's Model Boat Programme is about to culminate in Mini-Regattas on the model boat pond – and if last year's event is anything to go by, there's great fun to be had! We are very grateful to Woodbridge Model Boat Club who have designed and led this programme, and the great team of volunteers who help to make it happen.

Woodbridge Regatta is on **Sunday 19th July**. In the John Gibbins Gallery of The Longshed, Clare Lightfoot will be showing the work in progress on the 'River Tapestry', an 18' long depiction in textile art of the River Deben, its flora, fauna and heritage. The photo shows a detail of how the river itself is created in stitchwork. Do come along to meet Clare and to see some of the work being done by the volunteers involved with her in producing this wonderful piece of textile art.

'The King's River' tapestry depicting the story of King Raedwald and his ship will also be on display.

A little while ago we had a surprise phone call from the manager of Hasketon Road Co-op store to tell us that he and his staff wanted to actively raise funds for us this summer. This was terrific news. It is, of course, always a pleasure to have our work as a Trust recognized and we very much appreciate their support. Another recent phone call was from the daughter of Edith Pretty's milliner!

Mrs Pretty was the amazing lady who owned the Sutton Hoo estate when the sensational burial site of a Great Ship and treasures was uncovered in 1939 – a discovery that changed the world's understanding of Anglo-Saxon history. At 3pm on **Saturday, 1st August** (Edith's birthday) we will honour her life and times with two talks and a cream tea. Kim Davis will speak about Edith Pretty herself, and Clare Lightfoot will speak about 1930s' and '40s' fashions. Tickets are £10 inclusive of the cream tea and are available from Eventbrite or The Longshed Gift Shop. Please note that numbers are limited and admittance will be by ticket only.

Summer opening times: during the summer months, The Longshed's opening hours will be **10am - 4pm on weekdays, and 11am - 4pm at weekends and on Bank Holidays**. Entry to The Longshed is free, and dogs on leads are welcome.

BURSARIES SUPPORT YOUNG LOCAL TALENT

Young people who seek to pursue a career in the performing arts sometimes face huge challenges. Not only is there fierce competition for places in recognised colleges, but the costs of travel, living and accommodation on top of tuition fees and associated expenses can represent a daunting obstacle to prospective students and their parents.

In a bid to help home-grown talent fulfil its potential, the local charity, Friends of East Suffolk Performing Arts (FESPA) awards one-off bursaries of up to £1500 to a few carefully selected students each year.

FESPA bursaries are designed to provide financial support and encouragement to deserving students of the performing arts who either live in the area or have strong local connections and who have already obtained a place at a recognised institution. Each student is required to submit an application form and CV and specifically to explain how the bursary would be of help. References also have to be supplied.

In the last sixteen years, FESPA has awarded bursaries worth more than £75,000 to students of acting, dancing, music and stage management.

If you are hoping to start a specific performing arts course in the autumn this year, now is the time to submit an application.

You can let FESPA know later if and when you receive a definite offer of a place. The closing date for completed applications is midnight on **Friday July 31 2026**.

WOODBIDGE FESTIVAL OF ART AND MUSIC

Woodbridge Festival of Art and Music is celebrating an 'inspiring' start to its two new projects, Civil Nights and The Clarkson Campaign, which saw people dancing between the pews at the cathedral-like St Mary's Church and brought in visitors from across the UK.

A sold-out launch event was headlined by legendary Soul Jazz singer Lee John at St Mary's Church, alongside a DJ night with Bopper Ranking, DJ Ben Osborne and Girl in a T-Shirt, at New Street Market, in Woodbridge over the May bank holiday weekend.

The events attracted an audience from across the UK, with people travelling from London, Luton, Glasgow, Stevenage, Sheffield, Basingstoke, Cardiff, Wolverhampton and Canada, as well as a local crowd from Woodbridge, Ipswich and all over East Anglia.

The new Civil Nights and the Clarkson Campaign projects have been launched by Woodbridge Festival to celebrate the legacy of local civil rights pioneers John and Thomas Clarkson. The Clarksons brothers founded two of the world's first civil rights movements, the campaign for the abolition of slavery and the world's first peace movement.

Woodbridge Festival Founder Ben Osborne gave a short speech on the history of John and Thomas Clarkson, who are both buried in and near Woodbridge; with John being buried in the family vault in St Mary's churchyard. Ben said greater recognition of these international figures was long overdue in Suffolk.

Father Nigel Prior, Rector of St Mary's Church, said he is frequently asked where John Clarkson is buried by visitors to the town, because there's currently little public information about the Clarksons in the town. And the Mayor of Woodbridge, Councillor Phipps, said both the Clarkson Campaign and Civil Nights events were a welcome and needed addition to the town.

The launch event was headlined by Lee John, singer of chart-topping act Imagination, who performed a collection of new and classic jazz songs, alongside his dance hits, such as 'It's Just An Illusion' and 'Body Talk'. His star-studded jazz quartet included musicians from Simple Minds, Soweto Kinch's band, Sister Sledge and Jazz Warriors.

The launch events have been followed with an avalanche of enthusiasm, with the Church's social media accounts describing it as an "inspiring" and "fantastic night" and audience members posting comments such as "St Mary's was rocking! It was brilliant! Thank you". Lee John posted to Instagram saying: "What a great night".

Woodbridge Festival and Civic Nights founder Ben Osborne says: "This was the best start we could hope for, for Woodbridge Festival's Clarkson Campaign. It proves the need for both this annual celebration and a permanent space in memory of the brothers - and all they inspired to follow them."

More events are scheduled later this summer.

FROM JENNY RIDDELL-CARPENTER MP



Over the past two years, I have been campaigning to improve SEND services across Suffolk, working closely with families, carers, schools and local organisations who see every day how difficult the system has become for children who need additional support. This work matters because too many families are still facing long delays, inconsistent support, and a system that can feel difficult to navigate at a time when they most need clarity and reassurance.

With a new administration now in place at Suffolk County Council, responsibility for delivering education and SEND provision sits firmly with them.

I have made clear my concerns that SEND may not be given the priority it requires, and that vulnerable young people and their families risk being left behind if urgent action is not taken. That is why I have written directly to the new Cabinet Member for SEND, Councillor Tony Gould, setting out a clear framework for improvement and what I believe needs to happen next. In my letter, I outlined five key steps to improve SEND provision in Suffolk: stronger leadership and accountability, better communication with families, clear timelines for new SEND school places in Saxmundham and Bury St Edmunds, a greater focus on specialist provision within mainstream schools and rural areas, and more consistent engagement with MPs and stakeholders on complex cases affecting local families. Taken together, these are practical steps that would begin to rebuild trust in the system and provide a clearer direction for families who currently feel unheard and unsupported. Alongside this, I am continuing to encourage residents to share their experiences and add their voice to the call for improvement.

Local pressure matters, and it is important that decision-makers understand the scale of concern across our communities. You can read my letter in full and find out more about my work on SEND at: www.jennyforsuffolkcoastal.org/send

Together, we have already seen progress in raising these issues more prominently. But there is much more to do, and I will continue pressing Suffolk County Council and working with families until children across Suffolk Coastal get the support, provision and consistency they deserve.

WOODBIDGE MUSEUM

The photograph is of one of the two mortuary chapels built in The Old Cemetery. The Old Cemetery was opened in 1856 and we believe the photograph was taken in the late 1860s. The photographer was Alfred S. Fisk of St John's Street, Woodbridge, who traded there between 1858 and 1894.

There were two chapels built, one for Anglicans and the other for Roman Catholics, dissenters and other non-conformists. The Old Cemetery is a notable example of a Victorian garden cemetery and if you would like to know more about it one of our recently published Mini History Series is available to purchase from Woodbridge Museum. We plan to produce further booklets in the series but for now the following are available:

The Voyages of the Thomas 1854-66 about the 'billyboy' that sailed out of Woodbridge, The Lady Alice Kenlis - the 'other ship' at Sutton Hoo, The Zeppelin Raid, 1915, and The Old Cemetery, Woodbridge. The illustrated booklets cost £2.50 each, with a discount for 'Friends of Woodbridge Museum'.

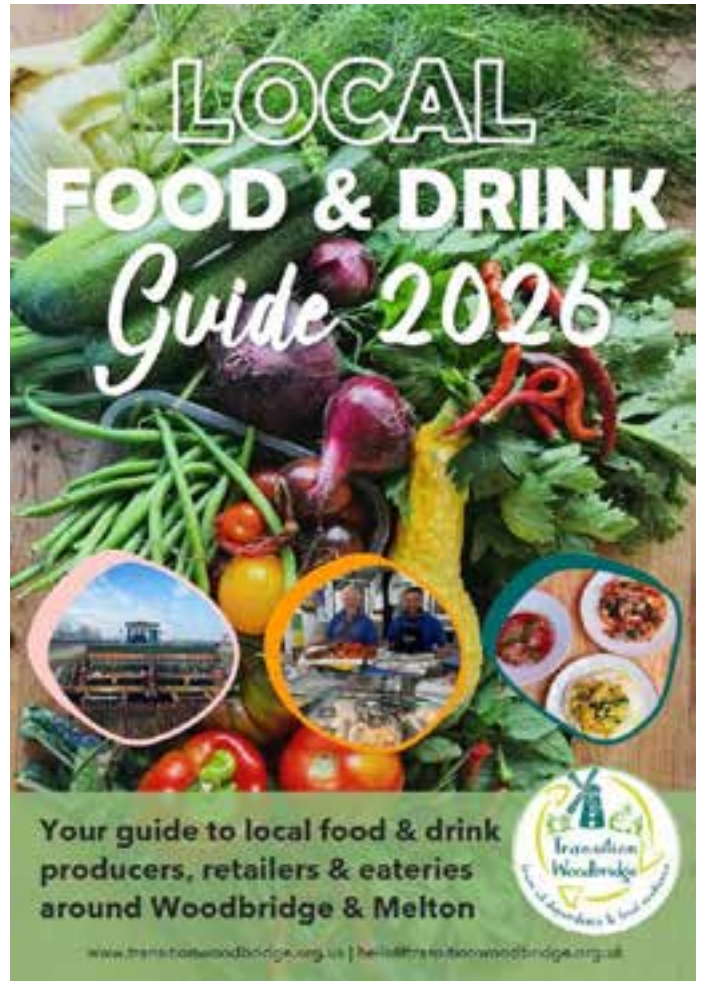

PROJECT UPDATE

JULY 2026

As we enter the summer, we are finalising work to complete the construction phase of Yoxford and Friday Street roundabouts at the end of July.

Traffic cones and compounds will be removed at Yoxford, and the roundabout will be handed over to Suffolk County Council Highways. At Friday Street, traffic management will be significantly reduced, however access to the construction of the two-village bypass for Stratford St Andrew and Farnham will continue. Grass seed will now be sown ahead of further planting in the autumn.

Along the B1122 corridor the required smaller road closures are being implemented. Pretty Road is now closed for the duration of the Sizewell Link Road construction. Further down the B1122, the Moat Road junction remains closed, however Abbey Lane has now reopened and Buckleswood Road is due to be fully opened without traffic management in mid-July.

Road safety improvement works along the A12 continue in Marlesford. A temporary speed limit is in place to ensure the safety of all road users as the pedestrian crossing is installed, pavement and road junctions improvements and upgrades are all carried out. These works are due to be completed in the late summer.

Work at our Park and Ride sites continue, with further capacity being increased at the Wickham Market site with the access roads now complete. The roundabout at the park and ride in Darsham continues to progress, with the required traffic management now lifted at peak times. Willow Marsh Lane has now been reopened to traffic, pedestrians, and cyclists.

The rail link work continues at pace, with all the tracks laid for the temporary rail line around Leiston installed and trains beginning to run in and out of the temporary construction area. Over the coming months level crossing gates will be installed or upgraded along both the Saxmundham to Leiston, and Ipswich to Lowestoft branch lines, specifically at Melton and Darsham. This will require road closures and traffic management throughout installation.
