



DREAMS COME TRUE FOR YOUNG BIN LORRY FANS

East Suffolk Services recently welcomed three young local boys to one of its depots after receiving a letter explaining just how much they love bin lorries.

Arthur (9), Henry (6) and Oscar (3) wrote to the team with thoughtful questions about waste and recycling vehicles, sharing their fascination with bin lorries and even their own Lego creations inspired by them. Touched by their enthusiasm, East Suffolk Services invited the boys and their parents to visit the Ufford depot for a behind-the-scenes experience.

During the visit, each of the boys received a goodie bag including a personalised high-visibility vest, baseball cap and beanie hat. East Suffolk Services Managing Director Cassandra Clements shared her own love for Lego, showing them her bin lorry and recycling centre made from Lego, which she proudly displays in her office.

The visit included a guided tour of the depot, where the boys were able to ask questions about bin lorries, waste collection and recycling directly to the team.

However, the highlight of the day was seeing a bin lorry driven into the depot yard and being invited to climb inside the cab.

Transport, Fleet and Workshop Operations Manager, Ben Brame gave the boys a full run-through of the vehicle, explaining what the different controls and buttons are used for. The boys even had the chance to sit in the driver's seat and try out some of the controls themselves.

The children were particularly impressed by how clean and well-maintained the vehicles were and spent the whole visit with huge smiles on their faces. Arthur even commented on how 'shiny and fancy' the trucks are.

The visit also gave the boys the opportunity to learn about the different roles carried out by bin crews and ask all of their questions about how the service operates.

East Suffolk Services Managing Director Cassandra Clements said: "We received the most wonderful letter from Arthur, Henry and Oscar, explaining their interest in our bin lorries. They asked so many excellent questions that we felt the best thing to do was invite them to the depot so they could meet the team and see everything for themselves.

"It was an absolute pleasure to host the boys and their parents, and to give them a guided tour. Seeing their excitement made it a really special day for everyone involved."

Arthur said: "We love bin lorries and always look out for them. We have even made a bin lorry out of Lego. Whenever I see East Suffolk Services trucks out and about, I like to take a picture and then copy the design on our Lego version."

The boys' mum, Laura Davies, added: "We had the most amazing time. A huge thank you to everyone involved. It really was so special. Arthur, Henry and Oscar loved it so much. The East Suffolk Services team were brilliant with the boys, and it meant so much to us all."

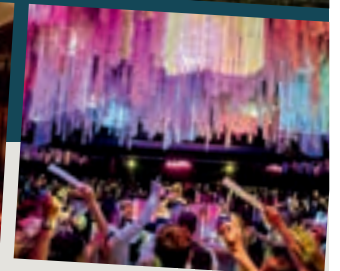

WOODBIDGE RIVERSIDE TRUST

This year's **Model Boat building programme** for year 6 students is underway! Twice a week for five weeks the Galley becomes a pop-up workshop, with tutorials and practical sessions on the basic principles of boat design and construction. The children work in teams of three to produce their boat, and the final week of the programme is a mini-Regatta on the Woodbridge model boat pond. Members of the Model Boat Club are leading the sessions, supported by a number of their and our volunteers.

Last year we ran a pilot project. It was great fun, and as the weeks went by, natural leaders and natural engineers emerged from within the individual teams.

The children loved being able to work with tools - under very close supervision, of course!

The Gallery in The Longshed is an ideal venue for a number of educational projects and is useable year-round. Some 1800 children have now participated in our *'Follow the Ship'* programme.

We have run a variety of skills-building workshops there and other organisations have hired it for talks and meetings and other community events.

This photo is from *'A New Riverside'*, a recent talk by Bryan Knibbs about the development of Deben Wharf and Whisstock's Place.

As it is an important part of the Town's history, we had the talk professionally videoed and we hope to share that more widely soon.



The Gallery is also the home of *'The King's River'* tapestry – an 'homage' in textile art to the Sutton Hoo story which attracts visitors from far and wide.

Our next Talk is on **Saturday 13th June** at 3pm in the John Gibbin Gallery, and is about gingerbread! Our speaker, Sarah Hopcroft, is a successful businesswoman, whose family business provides quality gingerbread to (among others) some prestigious London stores. Her firm was recently featured in the BBC series *'Inside the Factory'*.

Sarah has a home in Woodbridge and is one of our volunteers. Tickets are £8 to include refreshments (ginger cake may be on the menu!) and are available from Eventbrite (no booking fee) and The Longshed Gift Shop.

FROM JENNY RIDDELL-CARPENTER MP



One issue I hear about time and time again across Woodbridge and the surrounding villages is buses – or in many cases, the lack of them altogether. Suffolk Coastal really has become a ‘bus desert’. Whether it’s routes that have quietly disappeared over recent years, services that don’t run at the times people actually need them, or buses that are simply too unreliable to plan around, too many people across Suffolk Coastal are being left behind.

For some residents, particularly older people, young people and those without access to a car, this creates very real barriers to everyday life. It can mean struggling to get to work, college or medical appointments, or finding it harder to stay connected to family, friends and local communities. Reliable public transport is not a luxury – it’s essential, especially in rural communities such as ours.

That’s why I’ve launched a constituency-wide bus survey to gather direct feedback from residents about what is and isn’t working. I want to hear from people who rely on buses regularly, those who used to use them but no longer can, and those who feel local services simply don’t meet their needs.

What makes this even more frustrating is that Suffolk has received millions of pounds in Government funding intended to improve local bus services.

Between 2023 and 2025 alone, Suffolk County Council received almost £3.8 million through Bus Service Improvement funding - yet the total number of annual bus miles operated across the county fell by more than 1.1 million miles, from 9.18 million in 2022 to 8.01 million in 2025. Residents are understandably frustrated that despite repeated promises of improvement, many communities are seeing fewer services rather than more.

With a new Reform-led County Council now in place, I will be pushing hard to ensure rural and coastal communities are not overlooked when decisions are made about transport funding and service provision. Too often our villages and smaller towns are treated as an afterthought when it comes to public transport, and I will continue putting pressure on the County Council to deliver the improvements residents have been promised.

Later this year, I’ll also be bringing together operators, local decision-makers and residents for a roundtable discussion focused on practical improvements and long-term solutions. Good public transport helps keep communities connected, supports local businesses and reduces isolation – particularly in rural and coastal areas like ours.

ALDEBURGH YACHT CLUB NEWS

It has been a busy time at Aldeburgh Yacht Club since the sailing season started in March. The moorings on the river have been filling up, as has the dinghy park.

The club is an RYA training centre which is run by our new full-time instructor Seb Garfield. Seb, who is from Woodbridge, has a busy schedule of courses running across the year, having already delivered instructor and power boat training in his first few weeks.

In June, we will be welcoming 13 of the local primary schools with up to 250 children joining in during our programme. This will be delivered by Seb with the backing of the Aldeburgh Schools Sailing Trust and numerous volunteer members whose long-standing support has brought over 2,000 children for sailing and water sports on the Alde in recent years. We will also host older students from South London alongside our partners, the BigKid Foundation.

Junior sailing started on Sundays in April. In July we will move to a daily programme, followed in August by our Junior and Youth Regatta and then our main Regatta. We are celebrating the achievements of Matilda Nicholls, one of our members who has been one of the British Sailing Team since 2019 and is now well into her Olympic campaign for Los Angeles 2028 and Brisbane 2032.

On the water, we have been racing on Saturdays and Wednesdays and have held open meetings and our annual two-day Spring Regatta.

We are expecting visitors throughout June including cruisers from the Royal Yacht Squadron and to join our Dragon class. Our Loch Long sailors are heading to Cornwall and Scotland over the coming weeks.

EXCEPTIONAL REPORT FOR WOODBRIDGE SCHOOL

Woodbridge School Receives Exceptional Report Following Recent ISI Inspection, March 2026

Shona Norman, Head:



I am delighted to be able to share with you our exceptional report from our recent Independent Schools Inspectorate (ISI) inspection and can confirm that all regulatory standards have been met, highlighting numerous areas of excellence across School life.

The inspectors took their time to get to understand the culture of our values driven School and its inner workings. Their findings reflect the school that we all know and states that every child thrives through the support of our staff, governors, pastoral care, the curriculum offering itself, and our extensive co-curricular offering.

Having introduced a new inspection framework in September 2023, the ISI's new framework does not use single word judgements or grades; instead, inspectors report on whether standards are met or unmet with a reference to each section of a five point framework.

ISI standards are inspected and considered relating to:

- Leadership and management
- Quality of education
- Students' physical and mental health and emotional wellbeing
- Students' social and economic education and contribution to society
- Safeguarding

A team of nine inspectors visited Woodbridge School in March 2026, three years on from our last inspection where the School achieved double 'Excellent'.

As well as observation and analysis, the inspectors considered the views of students, staff and parents who responded to the ISI's confidential pre-inspection questionnaire to reach their conclusions. Confirming within the report that students across the entire School feel, "...overwhelmingly happy and safe in School.

They are secure in the knowledge that they are cared for well", it goes on to share that our boarders, "are happy and proud of their house", which speaks volumes for their experience living and learning at Woodbridge School.

Going on to highlight the School's values of character, kindness, community and excellence, *"Leaders ensure that the values are evident in policies and daily routines. Because of this, students' behaviour and treatment of others is notably courteous and considerate. Leaders create a culture where mutual respect is paramount and the School environment is welcoming, differences are respected and students are able to express their individuality."*

Ever-encouraging a sense of belonging, all staff, including those that comprise the Senior Leadership Team, share exceptional relationships with students throughout the School, and the report recognised this with, *"Leaders are highly visible around the site, inspiring trust and confidence among students, staff and parents. They teach classes and know students and all members of staff by name, using learning walks to monitor standards and to keep informed about all aspects of School life. Their determination to be visible in the School community creates an egalitarian culture with a marked sense of belonging. Leaders model the Schools values, treating others with kindness and respect and are always eager to improve."*

In terms of success, the report recognises that, *"Students of all ages achieve highly in relation to their starting point."*

That recognition extends to detail that this is true for all students in relation to support for SEND, EAL, pastoral and academic need.

With over 100 co-curricular activities on offer throughout the School, the report also noted, *"Students participate in a broad and stimulating co-curricular programme which includes opportunities in academic pursuits, drama, music, creative arts, debating, outdoor pursuits and service opportunities, as well as options such as woodturning. Chess is popular.*

Many take speech and drama exams and success rates are high. Every child in Prep school participates in co-curricular offer, benefitting from the way the programme builds skills and allows them to make new friendships and have fun."

Also acknowledging the importance of the benefit of linking education to real-life, to futures beyond School and real-world learning, the report highlighted, *"Students are well prepared for life beyond School. Children in early years at Woodbridge School Prep work through a life skills programme which includes basic skills such as using cutlery or writing a thank you note. Year 1 are taught how to phone the emergency services and speak in front of an audience. In the Senior School life skills education such as cookery and first aid, sixth form experience allows students opportunities to manage their own travel, dress code and non-contact time. This cultivates students who embrace responsibility and think independently – and who are confident for their next stage.*

*"To summarise what is an incredibly detailed and extensive report, might be to highlight one very specific point made by the inspectors which was that **every child thrives**. The report confirmed that students recognise and acknowledge how lucky they are to be learning at Woodbridge School; they are fully aware of, where appropriate, the sacrifices made to ensure they learn in such a wonderful environment and are truly appreciate of it, in terms of the access they have to exceptional teaching, pastoral support and co-curricular opportunities – as well as having a truly beautiful physical environment in which to learn."*

PROJECT UPDATE

JUNE 2026

The works on Sizewell C are progressing very well and on track. We have launched a new hybrid website comprising the Sizewell C Works Tracker and causeway one that can be accessed from the Works Tracker.



This new feature will give the community further information on traffic management and road works across the East Suffolk network which help people plan journeys and further improve accessibility. The site will include an automated table of works related to Sizewell C which is updated in real time: szcworkstracker.co.uk/causeway-one-network

Construction works around the Friday Street roundabout and Yoxford roundabout continue with the removal of the redundant parts of the A12 and building of the footways. Once these are complete later this summer, the landscaping work will begin with initial planting of new hedgerows, trees and grass in the autumn.

At Yoxford, the similar work will require a weekend closure 8pm on Friday 19 June - 5am Monday 22 June.

In early June, we will start the next phase of the A12 improvement works. This time in Marlesford, in which a new pedestrian crossing will be built along with road junction improvements. These works will involve night time road closures and day time traffic management. The Sizewell C Works Tracker will be updated throughout the works.

The Park and Rides are open with Sizewell C workers parking their cars and catching a bus to get to the Leiston sites. The road adjustments have been completed around the Wickham Market site, and the roundabout at the Park and Ride in Darsham continues to progress with the required traffic management removed, easing the traffic flow.

Finally, the Two Village Bypass at Stratford St. Andrew and Farnham is now in the full construction phase. Most of the works are carried out away from the existing road network, which will reduce disruption on the road network. The new works compound that will be accessed from the A12 is now operating and the speed limits along the A12 have now returned to normal (30mph through the villages of Farnham and St Andrew, 50mph on the A12 towards or coming from Ipswich).

HALESWORTH ALE DAY

She says: "Halesworth has a great tradition of malting and a vibrant hospitality scene. The Halesworth Ale Day is a great opportunity to showcase the very best of our town. Visitors can take part in the festivities, while also visiting award-winning delis and cafés, and browse the town's independent shops.

"The event also shines a light on our local ales at venues including The Tap Room, The White Hart, The Angel and The Swan."

The event offers free family entertainment, which includes live theatre, giant bubble displays, stilt walkers, craft activities, face painting, drumming workshops and garden games. Visitors can also enjoy live music performances from brass, blues, folk and roots bands.

Halesworth's Market Square will be turned into a drinks market, offering produce from local breweries, vineyards, cider makers and distilleries alongside food vendors.

ORFORD C.O.E PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS

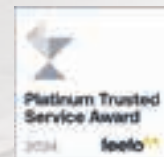
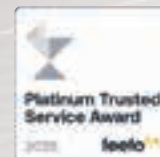
